

\$9,607,487 awarded 349 grants
to grantee partners in
79 countries



Since 2014, we have also supported 879 grants totaling €92 Million through AmplifyChange*.

*Amplify Change is a fund that supports civil society organizations across the world who advocate for improved policy and action on the most neglected sexual and reproductive health and rights issues. AmplifyChange is managed by Global Fund for Women with African Women's Development Fund and MannionDaniels.

In FY2020, Global Fund for Women grantee partners helped change 14 laws and policies in 12 countries.

Including a policy in Mexico that expands protections for 2.3 million domestic workers and a national law in Morocco that aims to protect Soulaliyate women's rights to land.

GRANTEE PARTNERS MAKE CHANGE BY ORGANIZING IN THEIR COMMUNITIES:

179 grantee partners in 56 countries built new alliances or strengthened partnerships with other women's rights organizations

94 grantee partners built the capacity of other groups through trainings, workshops, and peer learning

67 grantee partners in 35 countries increased opportunities for convening, peer learning, and joint planning

Our Vision & Mission


We envision a world where movements for gender justice have transformed power and privilege for a few into equity and equality for all.

We fund bold, ambitious, and expansive gender justice movements to create meaningful change that will last beyond our lifetimes.


Financial Overview
